After 27 years as Editor of the BRB Clifford Sather has decided to step down after the 2021 volume. The BRC wants to thank Cliff for his dedication and for his excellent work over the years. I want to add a very personal thank you for all the help and support that Cliff has given to me as I step into the role of President of the BRC.

Happily, J.H. (John) Walker has agreed to become the next editor of the BRC!

J. H. (John) Walker was awarded his PhD in Politics from the University of New South Wales (UNSW), Canberra, in 1995 for a thesis entitled "Power and Conflict in Sarawak, 1835-1868". He taught International and Political Studies at the UNSW, Canberra, for 25 years, focusing on southeast Asian history and politics. From 2016 to 2021 he was an Honorary Research Fellow at the University of Western Australia.

Dr. Walker is the author of *Power and Prowess: The Origins of Brooke Kingship in Sarawak* (2002, 2020), a co-editor (with Minako Sakai and Glenn Banks) of *The Politics of the Periphery in Indonesia: Social and Geographical Perspectives* (2009), and a contributing editor to *The Encyclopedia of Iban Studies* (2002), edited by Vinson Sutlive and Joanne Sutlive.

His articles on political culture and Sarawak history have appeared in such journals as Theory and Society, Modern Asian Studies, Review of Indonesian and Malaysian Affairs, Australian Journal of Political Science, Borneo Research Bulletin, Journal of Borneo-Kalimantan, Jebat: Malaysian Journal of History, Politics and Strategic Studies, Sarawak Museum Journal, Island and Australian Religion Studies Review.

Transitions

We have recently learned of the loss of the following greats in Borneo studies:

Herbert Whittier died on June 6, 2021. A full obituary will be forthcoming. Also of note is the fact that the Field Museum has taken on the archiving and care of Whittier's papers and material culture collection.

Professor Andrew "Pete" Vayda passed away on January 15, 2022. Professor Vayda was a member of the BRC editorial board. A full obituary will be forthcoming.

Lucas Chin, former Director of the Sarawak Museum and prolific writer on the cultural heritage of Sarawak has died. A full obituary will be forthcoming.
